

## Annual Torch Run supports the NH Special Olympics

### Local law enforcement officials run to raise funds for state's athletes

This year marks the 32nd anniversary of the Law Enforcement Torch Run to benefit Special Olympics New Hampshire.

Local law enforcement participated in the annual run, held June 1.

Special Olympics of New Hampshire (SONH) is a non-profit organization providing sports training and athletic competition for children and adults with mental challenges. Currently, more 3,000 participants and thousands of volunteers, friends and family members take part in SONH activities.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run is one of the largest Special Olympics fundraising events in the state. Every branch of state, municipal, county and federal law enforcement has participated in the Torch Run.

The Law Enforcement community has raised more than \$1 million in the history of the Torch Run.
